Your first math test grade of the school year will be based on the number of problems you completed on IXL. This goal of 1,000 problems is much easier to achieve than it may seem.

The rubric is:

1,000+ Problems	E
900-999 Problems	G
800-899 Problems	S
700-799 Problems	I

In order to keep track of the total number of problems that you've completed, follow these steps:

- Log into your IXL account and click on Math
- Then click on "Analytics" on the tool bar.
- Next click on "Usage"
- Click on "Date Range" and choose "Custom" on the drop down menu. Put the start date as June 10, 2017 and the end date is the date you are checking.

For every 200 problems that you complete over 1,000, you will earn a fun prize. The more problems that you complete, the bigger the prizes! After you have completed the list of skills above, you can then choose any 2nd grade skill to earn the bonus prizes.

We have been using IXL all year so this shouldn't be new to them.
